**When:** October 29 from 2-4pm. We will start inside and the last half hour will be outside Trunk 'N' Treating.

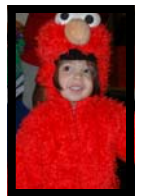
**Where:** RUMC Social Hall and Parking Lot

EARTH SPIRIT EXCHANGE YOUR STORIES, IDEAS AND TIPS

Earth Spirit Ministry is starting a new Heartline series featuring **your** stories, ideas and tips to encourage one another as fellow creation stewards. How do **you** care for creation? What works in **your** household for saving energy, lowering emissions, creating less waste, etc?

To kick off our series, we feature the pink "scooter of happiness" and her driver, Rev. Elizabeth Macaulay

"A big reason why the scooter of happiness is so delightful to me is the stewardship issue. It gets 80 – 100 mpg. Yesterday I put 50 miles on it, saving my car and the earth...Plus, I get to smell the air as I go. Works for me."

In the United States, the transportation sector accounts for approximately one-third of greenhouse gas emissions and is the fastest-growing major source of greenhouse gases. Transportation emissions are related to the amount of carbon dioxide in the fuel and how much fuel is used. To learn more about the fuel efficiency and greenhouse gas performance of the vehicle you own, or plan to own, visit [www.fueleconomy.gov](http://www.fueleconomy.gov) or [www.epa.gov/greenvehicles](http://www.epa.gov/greenvehicles).

To calculate your carbon emissions from driving your vehicle, estimate the total number of miles you drive per month and then divide this number by the total miles per gallon your car gets. This number will be the total gallons of gas you use in a month. Multiply that number by 19.4 pounds of carbon to get your total carbon emissions from driving. For example, the pink scooter, if driven 200 miles per month, averaging 90 mpg, would produce 43 pounds of carbon per month. An automobile that averaged 30 mpg, driven 200 miles per month, would produce 129 pounds of carbon per month. Savings of the scooter over the car: 86 pounds of carbon per month.

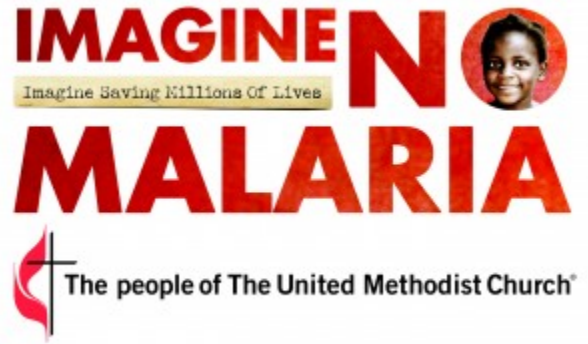
