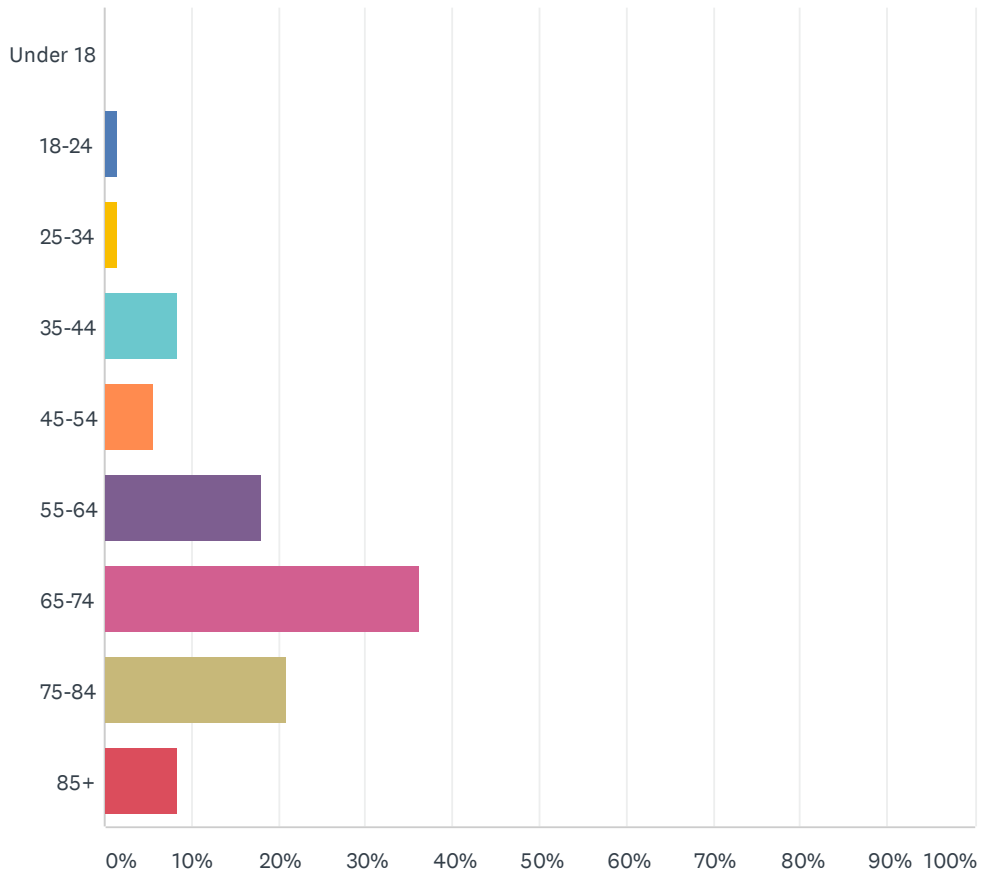


# Q1 What is your age?

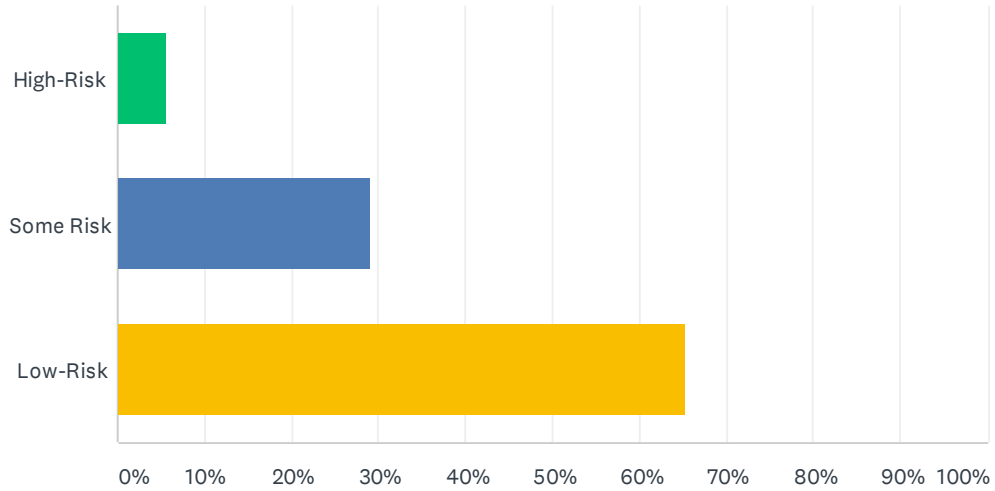

## Q2 How at-risk for COVID-19 do you consider yourself or members of your household (please consider vaccine status, health conditions, age demographics, etc.)?

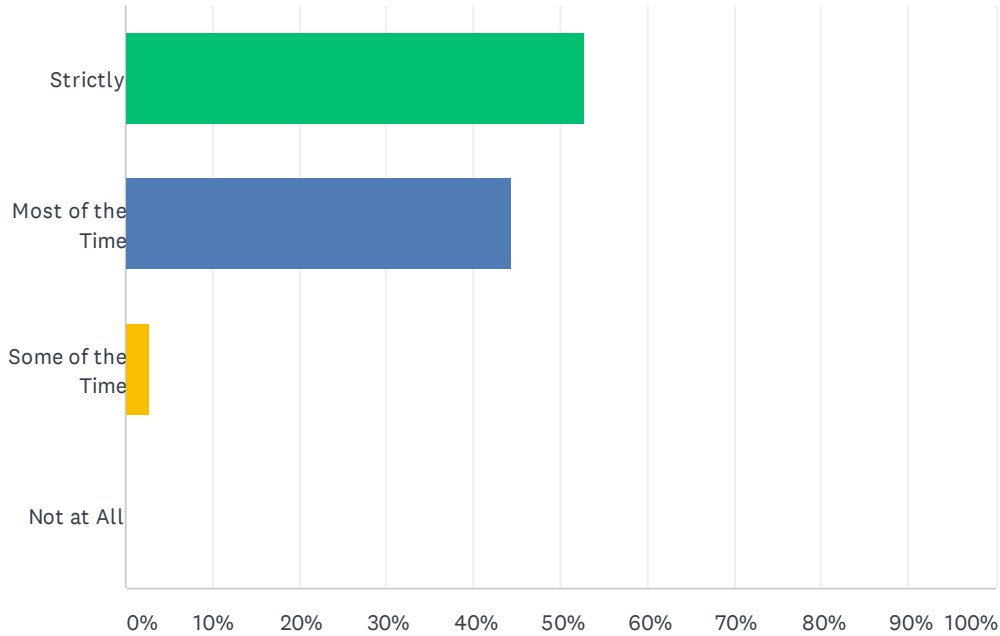

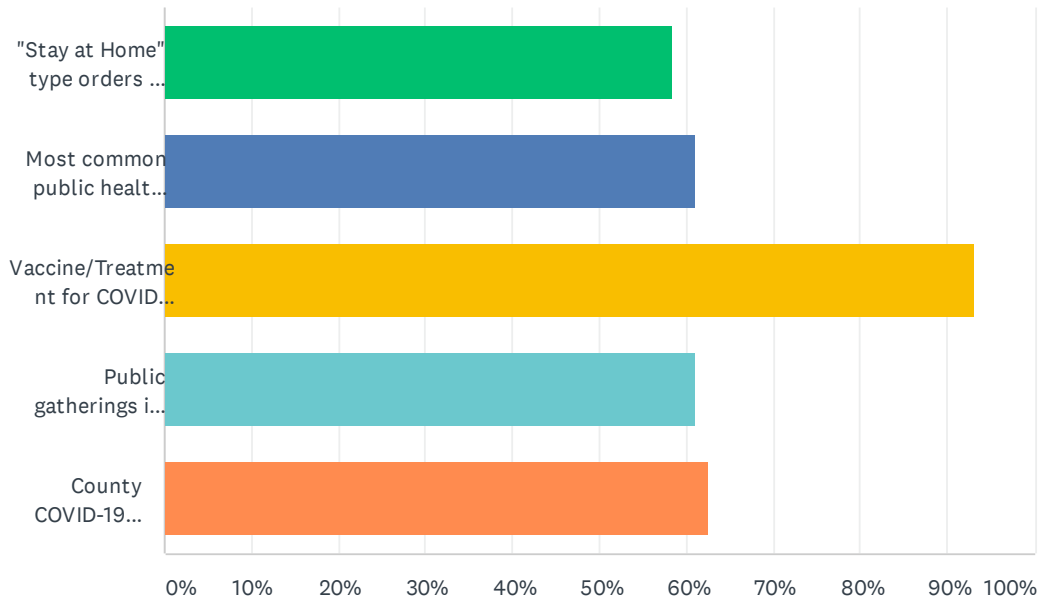

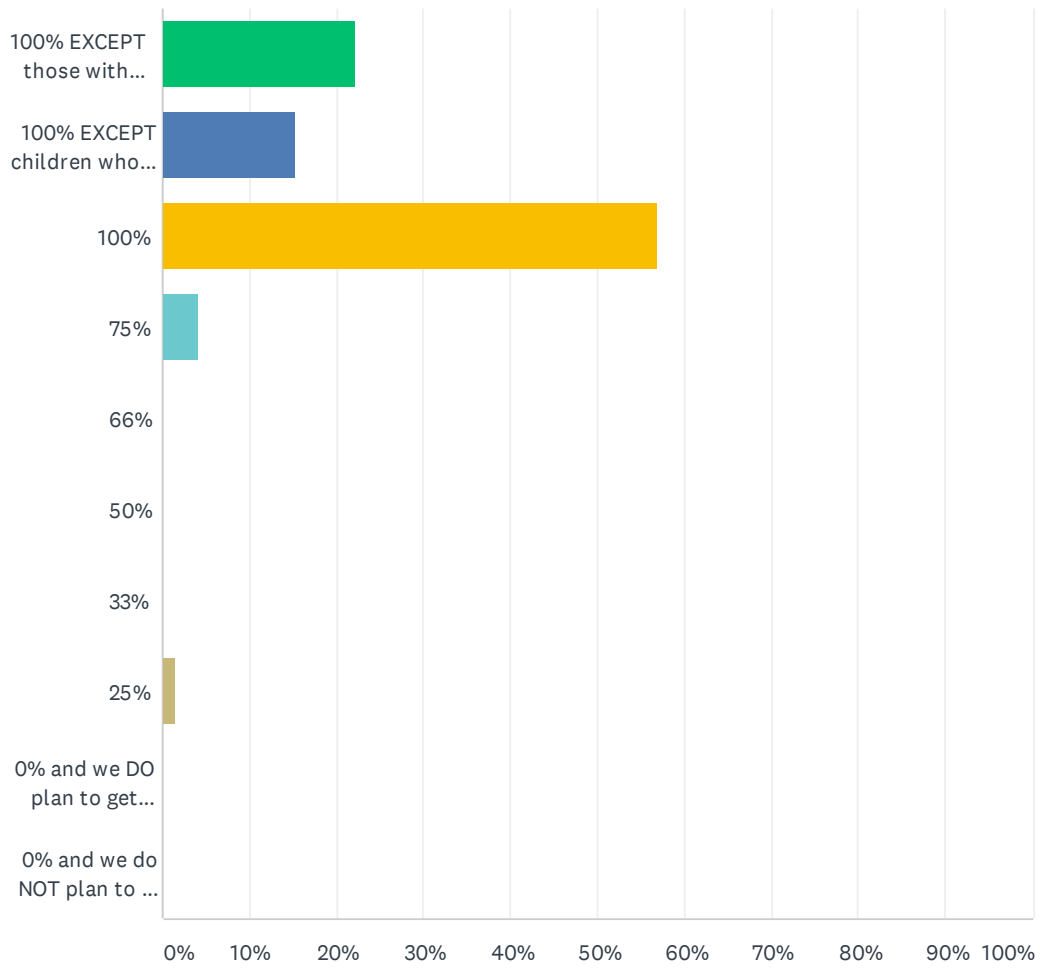

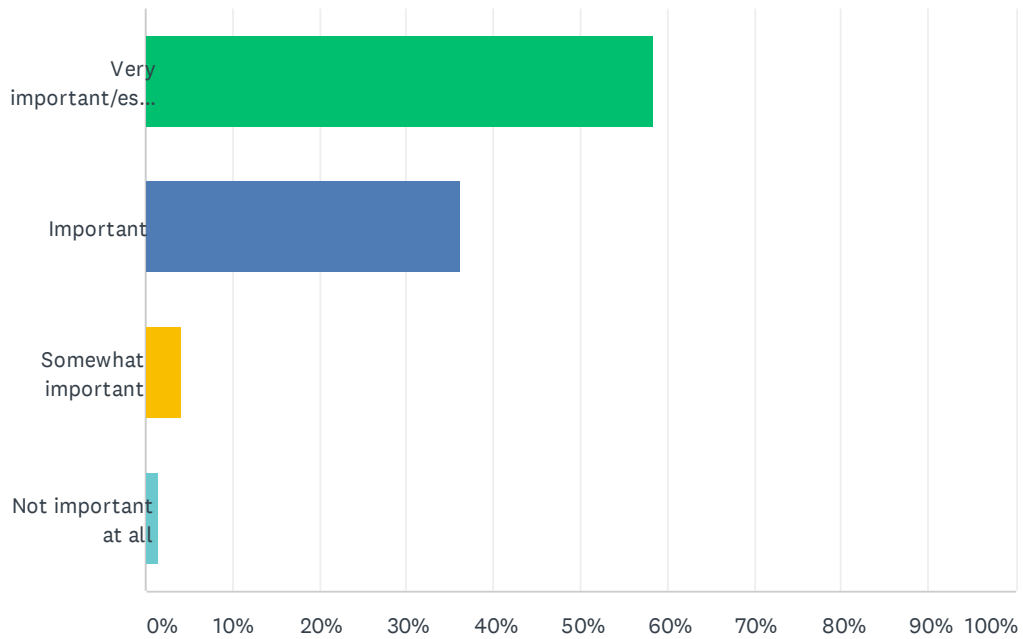

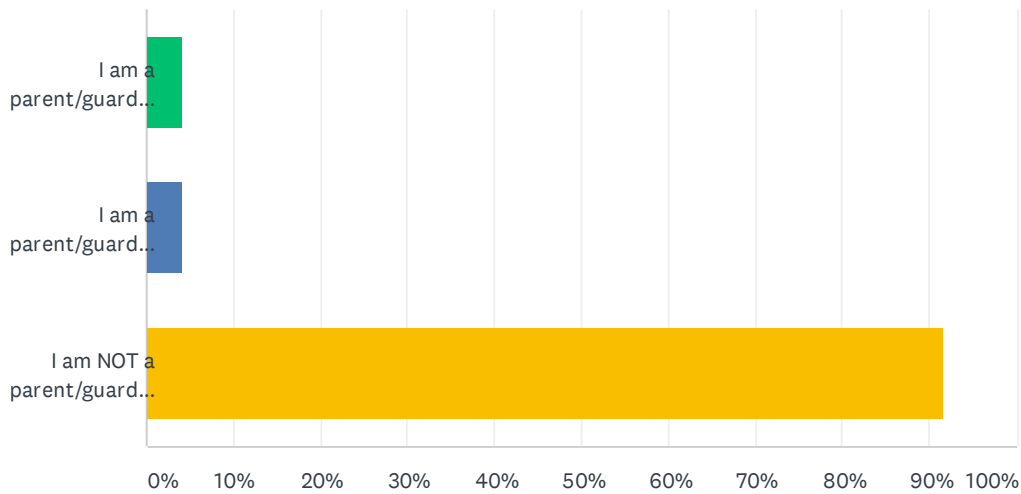

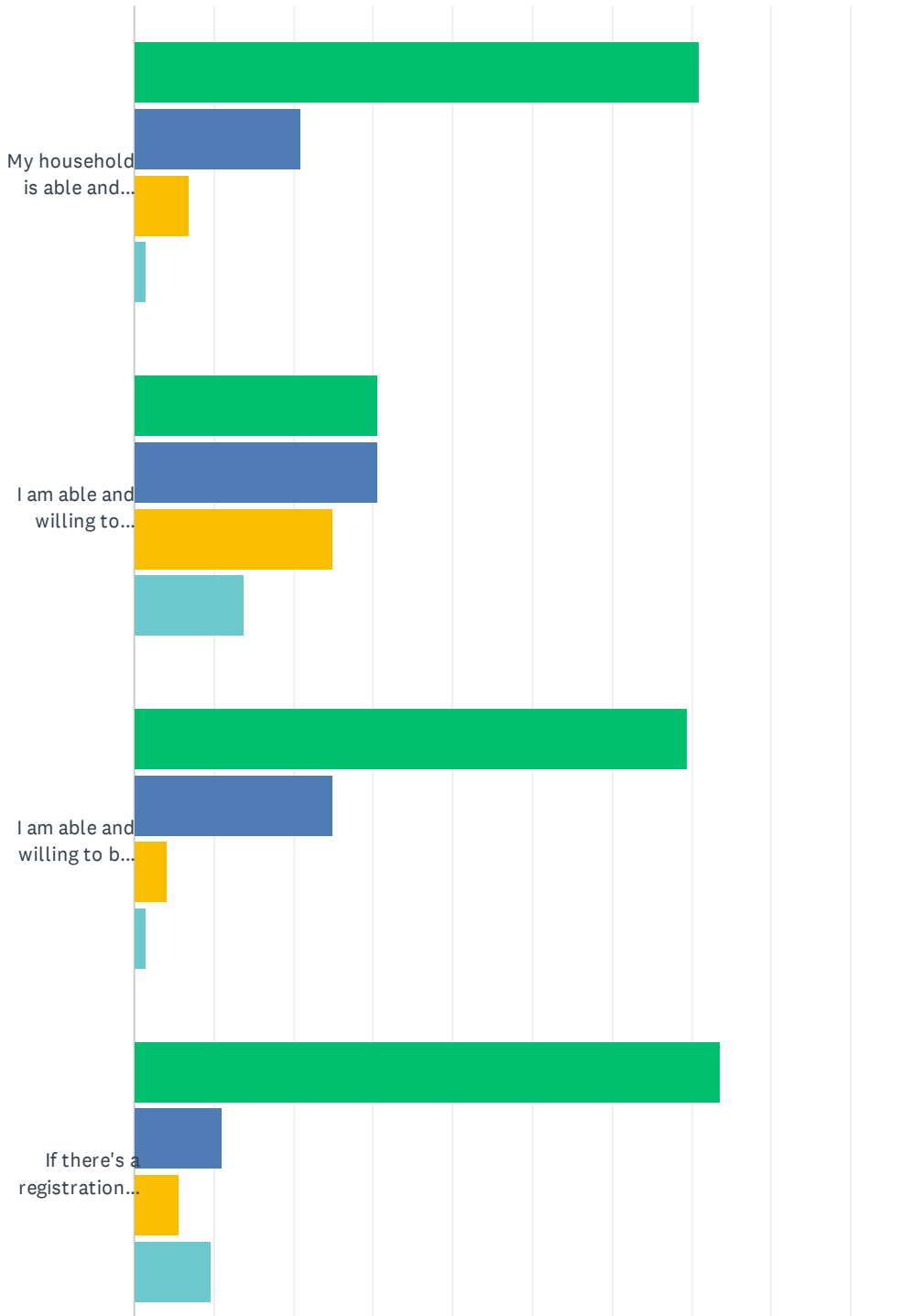

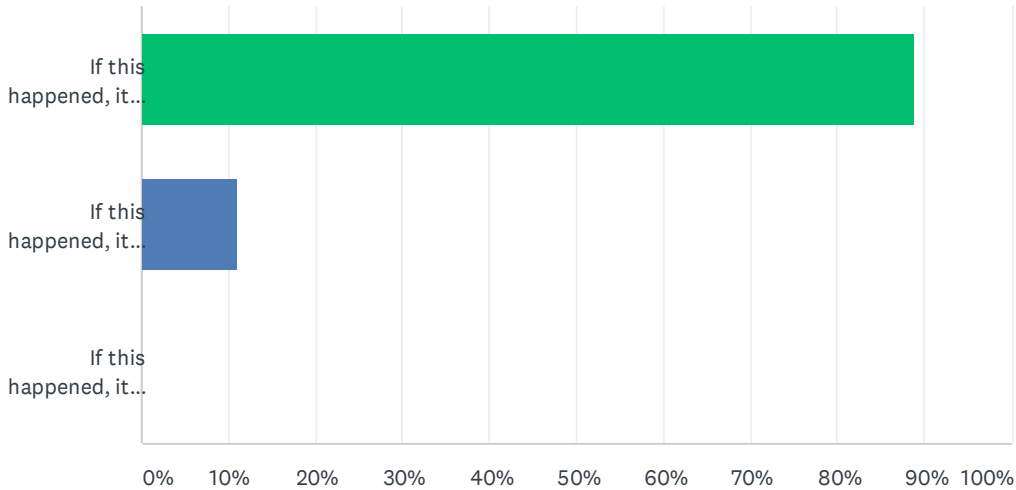

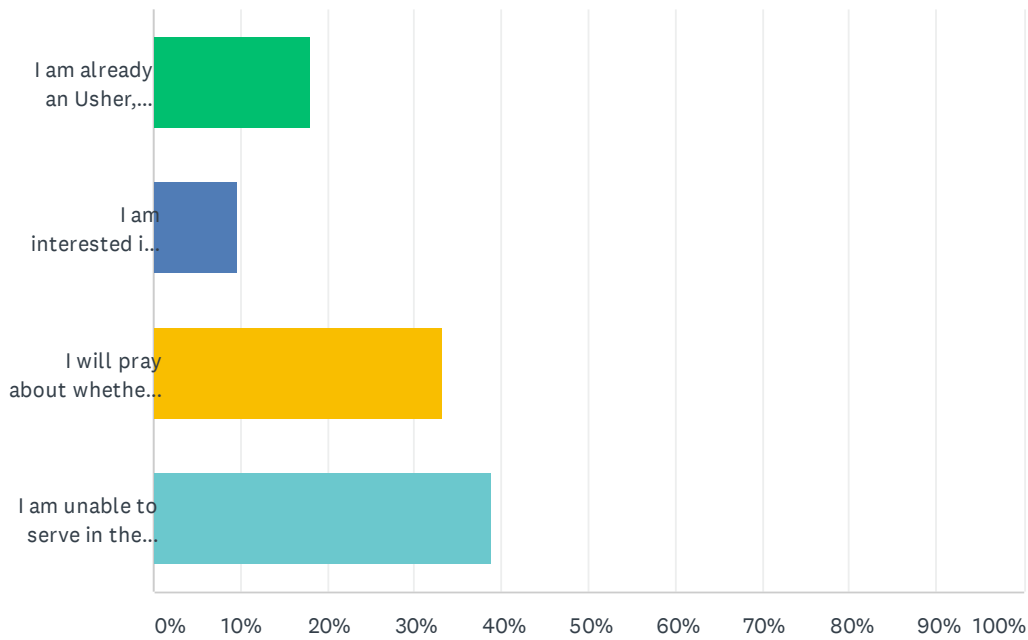

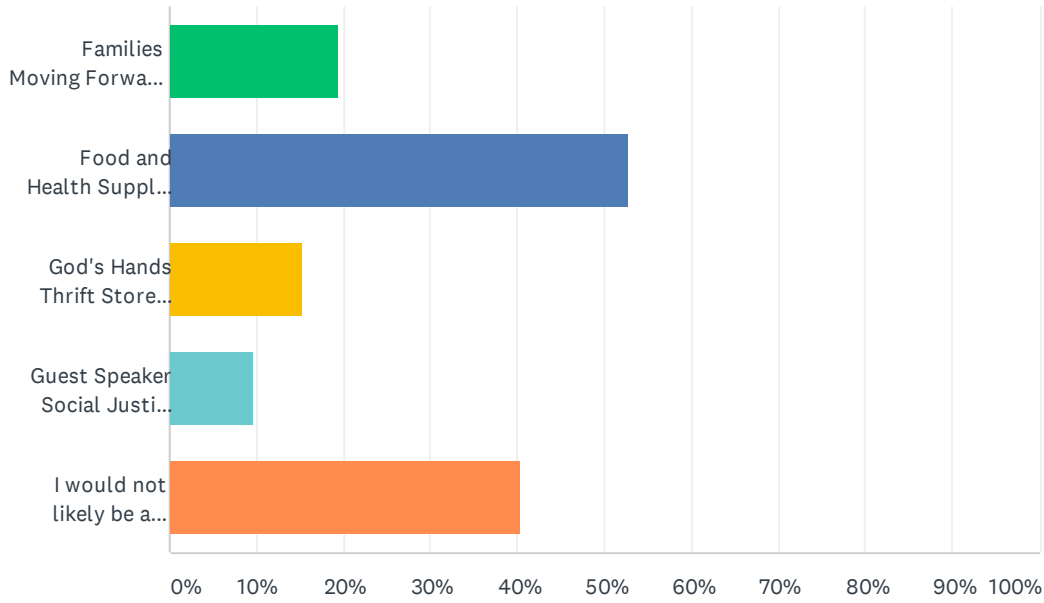

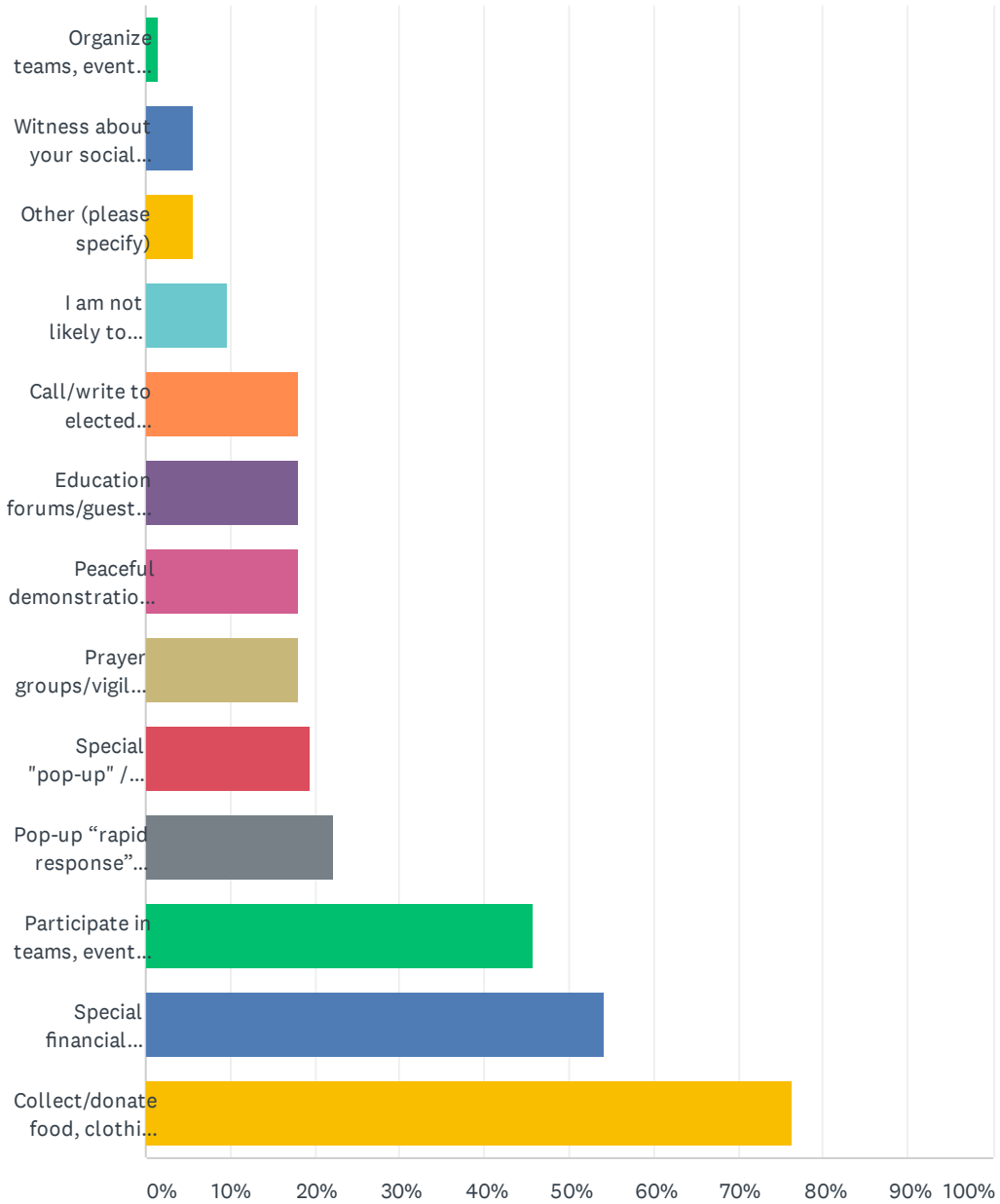
