NATE NOTE



Let's start with the truth: we don't know what the fall season will bring, and that's not easy. I've spoken with several of you about what the final quarter of 2021 may be like as school returns, regulations and recommendations change, viruses mutate, and whatever else may come our way. It's a time with uncertainty and many of you, and I am right there with you, are holistically exhausted by it. May we take comfort in the Holy Spirit who is ever-present and ever-loving.

I write my "Nate Notes" around a month before publication, so I'm not even going to bother writing what the current mask policy on campus is because it could be completely different by the time you read this! You may remember we had a more relaxed mask policy as we prepared for Phase 1 of regathering, only to return to something stricter when the headlines changed overnight. As always, I thank you for your patience and grace as we move forward together.

Despite uncertainty and change, there is celebration and hope. We are glad to be inperson once again for worship and gatherings. We hopeful the Missional Church are Consultation Initiative (MCCI) process proves fruitful for us. We celebrate all servant volunteers and paid staff for their incredible work these long distanced months. And we are hopeful God keeps breaking through in the life of our church. Have you felt God in your life, friends? Have you felt the conflux, the meeting of your life's journey with God's heart? I want to hear about it. As I wrote on the eve of the Phase 1 of regathering in-person as a church, please continue to bear a few things in mind as we journey into the fall season:

 We have <u>not</u> thought of everything! We are human, working our way through our first pandemic. Along the path to regathering, we continue to (re)discover pieces to sort out together. Some things are 100% in place, others are coming along, and still others aren't there yet. Thank you for your generous complements and your gentle feedback as we continue forward.

Regathering for in-person worship is an adjustment for everyone! In the Sanctuary, you can't change the thermostat, lighting, or volume (sorry, you can't mute the sermon!). You will be with people you know and people you don't know yet. Some elements will be familiar and comfortable, others new or different. We will all experience this to some degree; may we be in solidarity.

3. The situation can always change. The pandemic is not over and the headlines keep changing. It is possible we must stop inperson gatherings again later, a prospect that 89% of summer survey respondents said, "would be hard, yet I feel 'safety first' is the best move." We continue to monitor guidelines from the Minnesota Annual Conference, MDH, and CDC. Nearly 96% of summer survey respondents said 100% of their households are vaccinated except those with direct medical instructions not to be vaccinated due to current personal health conditions and/or children who are too young for currently-available vaccines. That is encouraging data as a church.

I am encouraged by you, Church. It has been my pleasure to be your pastor and to be the church togtether as we embark on our third fall season together. Please read this issue of The Heartline newsletter with fresh eyes seeking ways for you to stay informed, get involved, and be invitational. See what we're doing in Sunday School and Youth Group. Watch for music ensemble and small group details. Check out new classes and opportunties. Pay attention to worship matters and the Missional Church Consultaion Initiative (MCCI). After a season of so much distance, we are preparing for a season of fresh togetherness. Yes, we may still have uncertainty and yes, we may still have exhaustion, but we still have the Holy Spirit of the loving God who sent Jesus into the world. May this truth lead us through.

May God's blessings always be upon your lives, friends!

In these early days of regathering and discovering along the way how to do so well, we will give our hard-working servant volunteers a break and worship on September 5 only online and by touch tone phone. After this long season of distanced worship from necessity, we will experiment with distanced worship with intentionality. Please do not come to campus that day and thank you for your grace.

CHURCH BUS IS UP AND RUNNING

We are thankful to have a church bus and a team of dedicated drivers to welcome folks to church on Sunday mornings who could not attend worship otherwise. Such a blessing!

To ensure safety in this transition time, the following guidelines are to be observed. These guidelines follow the most recent mandates from the MN Metro Transit, MN Department of Health, and the CDC. Please be aware that they are subject to change as we keep an eye on evolving and ever changing data.

- 1. Drivers and riders need to wear appropriate fitting masks while on the bus.
- 2. Riders are encouraged to spread out throughout the bus when possible.
- 3. The bus has a maximum number of 14 passengers with no rider limits at this time.
- 4. Appropriate cleaning measures will be taken between scheduled trips.

WORSHIP ENTERS REGATHERING PHASE 2

It has been a blessing to gather in-person for worship since Phase 1 of regathering began on August 1. Remember, you are welcome for inperson worship and gatherings when you are ready. This fall, pending the wider pandemic scenario allows, we will continue in the next phases:

Phase 2 - September 12: In-person/online worship, indoor fellowship, outdoor Sunday School

Phase 3 - October 3: In-person/online worship, indoor fellowship, indoor Sunday School, Nursery

Phase 4 - November 7: Everything from Phase 3 plus the addition of small groups on Sundays




In many ways, the united worship service resembles both what worship has looked like during distanced times and pre-pandemic. Still, there are some differences that are worth noting:

1. **Music:** The usual rotation schedule for music in worship is 1st Sundays - Organ/Choral Music; 4th Sundays - Living Waters Band; 2nd/3rd Sundays - Blended Music. This "3 on, 1 off" schedule gives worship a balanced and unique musical flavor. May we innovate with courage, honor tradition, and expand the ways we praise God through the gift of music. Worship leaders on the chancel will often be unmasked. You must follow the latest guidelines for congregational singing and masking.

2. Sharing the Peace: 100% touch-free signs of peace are best for now. It is important to greet your neighbor with a mutual, consensual sign of peace. That means, "No thank you, and God's peace to you!" is a friendly and reasonable response to the question, "God's peace to you, would you like to shake hands?"

3. Conflux Candles: You may light a candle before worship or when invited during the Celebration Music to celebrate the conflux moments when your life's journey met God's heart.



5. Other Items: Place your offering in the single plate at the rear of the Sanctuary upon arrival. Please wear your name tag to help (re)build the church community. And mark attendance in the Welcome Pad if you are the person seated at the end of the pew, thank you.



WISDOM ON GIVING OTHERS THE GIFT OF WORSHIP

Dr. Rev. James Forbes is Pastor Emeritus of Riverside Church in New York City. A true pioneer, he was the first Black senior pastor at this interdenominational church and served there 18 years. A few years ago, he spoke of "The 75% Philosophy," a way to use our worship experience as an analogy of how we can embrace the diversity of God's creation:

"The 75% Philosophy [means that] a truly diverse congregation where anybody enjoys more than 75% of what's going on is *not* thoroughly integrated. So that if you're going to be an integrated church you *have* to be prepared to think, 'Hey, this is great, I enjoyed at least 75% of it,' because 25% should grant for somebody's precious liturgical expression that is probably odious to you; otherwise it's not integrating. So an integrating church is characterized by the need to be content with less than total satisfaction with everything. You have to factor in a willingness to absorb some things that are not dear to you but may be precious to some of those coming in."

This wisdom from an 87-year-old pastor who still preaches some of the best sermons in the nation may very well be a guiding principal for this church as we embark on one united worship service together. A variety of music and other elements all but guarantees each one of us will have some parts which are our favorites and others that are not for us. May we give these to one another as gifts as we share time and space together to worship. May we worship not our preferences but our God who loves us all!

Youth Group Returns


