NATE NOTE



Many years ago while I was in grad school before seminary, it was becoming more and more popular for the grad students in our department to travel to a famous conference. Once a year, students and faculty from all over the nation would come together for it and I admit I loved it both times I attended. The content was always good, of course, and as the locations got more exotic, the destination vibe also got more intoxicating, especially when we went to New York City.

My understanding is in the past, grad students would pay their conference fee and their air fare, while the department would cover the cost of the hotels. But the year we went to New York City, of course more students than ever wanted to go, and we were asked to help chip in for hotel rooms, even put on some fundraisers. Some students were frustrated by this. This had been free for years and years, so why the change now? Isn't this part of where our tuition money goes?!

One day in the TA room, as we sat at our desks grading undergrad students' work, some of my fellow grad students expressed their frustration about the hotel situation and left the room. Alone with one other student, he watched them leave and shook his head.

"They take this for granted," he said.

I said yeah, I see their point, but I don't think it's too much to ask us to help out. It's a lot of money and more people want to go this year, why not help.

He looked at me funny and asked, "Who do you think pays for all those hotel rooms?"

I said I figured the department did. He laughed and said, "No. The professor does."

According to this student, one of the professors in our department played a key role behind the scenes paying for as many of the student hotel rooms out of their own pocket as they could to give their students the opportunity to go to this conference. He had done this for years. Now that more of us wanted to go to NYC, the bill was getting pricey. My fellow student didn't shame me when he shared this, but he did give me a new

outlook on generosity done in secret. I wonder if most students knew this is how the rooms got paid for, it could've impacted classroom dynamics. Instead, the professor knew why he was doing it, and that inspired me to help with the fundraising and even donate several times to the cause as an alumnus. That's not for public kudos, ironically, but to show the impact of inspiration. We are hungry to be part of something bigger.

How we see "change through sharing" depends on our outlook on life. If we have a mindset of abundance - that all truly can be welcome because what is valuable to us is worth sharing - then change is possible. If we have a mindset of scarcity - we must be selective because what is valuable to us is for us - then change is scary. The question then becomes, which master are we trying to serve: God or wealth. Put another way, the God who shares freely with us and all beloved children throughout the world... or all the preferences and habits and other moth-eaten treasures we've accumulated along the way to knowing God. Jesus says no one can serve two masters.

I think about this a lot when it comes to sharing about our church. Our church, and this is a good church, is the way we have chosen to come together, organize, and deploy to grow in love of God and neighbor, reach new people, and heal a broken world. By coming together as a church, we are equipping ourselves and each other to live in faith, justice, and joy every day. How do we share that? How do we get others more than interested but *moved* by that?

As 2021 ends and we look ahead to a bright future in 2022, I want to thank you for all of the ways you have shared of your prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness in the life of your church. Sometimes, you were front and center. Other times, you were behind the scenes. We couldn't have done it without you. I know we live in mysterious times. I am grateful we have a God who does some of God's best holy work in, with, and through mystery. God is both front and center and behind the scenes. May we rejoice in a God of abundance and respond accordingly. Enter this season of fall colors, cold nights, Advent wonder, and Christmas joy with the love of Jesus in your bones and the flame of the Holy Spirit in your hearts!

MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY AT RICHFIELD UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

THE CHESTER E. AND MARION D. GROTH SCHOLARSHIP


CHURCH BUS IS UP AND RUNNING
