

Throughout her professional career, she served in many administrative roles, including administrative positions with the Minnesota and St. Paul Chamber Orchestras and most recently as a sales and marketing assistant for Wells Fargo Institutional Trust. She also served as an interim instructor of Hardanger fiddle at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota and was proud of her Norwegian heritage. She studied the Norwegian language as well as the Hardanger fiddle for many years.
