


Imposition of Ashes can be a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. Read more about the season of Lent on page 5.

NATE NOTE



As I write an article for the *Heartline* newsletter to be published in March 2022, I cannot help but look back at the articles I wrote for the *Heartline* newsletter to be published in March 2020. I know, I know, that was everybody's favorite month, ever. When anniversaries surface, be they for celebrations, tragedy, or something in-between, we often look back to before, take stock of today, and look ahead. As I reflect on those articles, I see a mixture of things that never happened, things that happened in a different way, and things yet to come.

Lots of things didn't happen, at least in 2020. I wrote that we'd have fun if we went out as a church for trivia night at local restaurants (if you put the right generations together, you get a team who knows both Lawrence Welk and Cardi B, and that's how you dominate!). I mentioned the success I'd had developing a Pub Theology ministry before to talk faith in local breweries. I asked you to join me for the Challenging Islamophobia in-person conference. We listed a "save the date" for summer fare like LYFE Camp, VBS, mission trips, BWCA trips, the carnival, and movie nights. This is a sampling of what didn't happen in-person in 2020, though some returned that year or in 2021 online, at least. I see the invitation I wrote to you to come see my children and me perform in Godspell at Aldersgate UMC and we luckily squeaked in two performances before lockdown.

A few things happened but in a different way than we expected. MCCI director Rev. Sue Nilson Kibbey was set to preach that month, but it would be 19 months before she would join us for worship. Likewise, our MCCI Express Day was set for September 2020 and we finally had it 13 months later this past October. We'd planned to have conflux candles in worship through Easter and now we celebrate our conflux moments as a regular part of worship. We also announced a goal to assemble at least

two taskforces that spring that have ended up reflected in our MCCI prescriptions: a space audit (Facilities Repurpose/Utilization Team) and a hospitality audit (Guest Connections Team). We had already been listening to God to break through. A pandemic slowed things down, but here we are today!

Finally, some things are yet to come. I wrote of outreach opportunities. We kept doing that and more are in store for this church. I wrote reminding you that if there's someone in the life of the church you haven't seen in a while to please be the person to reach out and invite them back. That is even more critical today and remember nothing will ever replace your personal invitation. I wrote that we need more servant volunteers in the tech booth during worship. Guess what? Talk about needed, needed this spring! And I wrote about needing volunteers for the next session of the General Conference. That's... maybe happening? It's still scheduled for Minneapolis, now August 29-September 6. though many questions linger about whether it can finally happen (which is challenging and painful for many reasons, Lord in your mercy).

What a bizarre list of things that did not come to pass, though they could still come this year or in the future. What a strange twist of fate for things that came in unexpected ways and in a new time frame. What an odd assortment of things which are right here, right now or on the horizon. This mix is a reminder that God has been preparing this church for new blessings for a long time. Now, it is up to us to say "Yes!" to God and take a few steps forward. We still dwell in pandemic mystery, and we are people of faith. We are people who are used to dwelling in mystery and seeing the holy around us. There is great joy and hope in that. May a longing for that great joy and hope carry us through this season of Lent in our journey to Easter.

Resurrection is always right around the corner.

Sometimes, it is indeed, already here. I love being your pastor. God bless you all!

Sound: Set up the microphones. Too loud? Turn it down. Too soft? Turn it up.

Slides: Tap "next" to get to the next slide or video.

Cameras: Tap "Camera 1," 2, or 3 as leaders go to their designated spots.

You will be trained, you will be welcomed, you will be amazed at how quickly you will become competent with your role. Plus, the camera operator gets to use a joystick!

Please step up if you have even <u>remote</u> skills/interest. We want to be able to continue to provide online worship experiences, and this relies on building a robust tech crew roster, thank you!

As announced at the church conference on January 30, the elected leaders of Ad Board approved a proposal to intentionally hold online-only worship with no in-person option on the following Sundays:

- May 29, 2022 (Memorial Day weekend)
- July 3, 2022 (Independence Day weekend)
- September 4, 2022 (Labor Day weekend)
- December 25, 2022 (Christmas Day)
- January 1, 2023 (New Year's Day)

Pandemic concerns will linger in 2022 as we live into an era of more stability. We continue to (re)build worship teams and giving our many servant volunteers intentional breaks will give them more excitement and less obligation to lead worship services. These Sundays had historically low attendance prepandemic and worship attendance numbers continue to rebuild. Similar to worship on September 5 and December 26, there will be a quality worship experience that is online and by phone only. Our Bishop and other conference leaders have affirmed our creative approach and may we affirm the value of online worship as we find God in yet another way.

LENT

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, this year on March 2. Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Ash Wednesday emphasizes a dual encounter: we confront our own mortality and confess our sin before God within the community of faith. The form and content of the service focus on the dual themes of sin and death in the light of God's redeeming love in Jesus Christ. The use of Ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship, and the Imposition of Ashes can be a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation.

Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word Lencten, which means "spring." The season is a preparation for celebrating Easter. Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by converts and then became a time for penance by all Christians. The First Sunday describes Jesus' temptation by Satan; and the Sixth Sunday (Passion/Palm Sunday), Christ's triumphál entry Jerusalem and his subsequent passion and death. Because Sundays are always little Easters, the penitential spirit of Lent should be tempered with joyful expectation of the Resurrection.

MUSIC MINISTRY

We have a lot of music coming up for Lent that we hope will be spiritually meaningful. Ash Wednesday is on March 2nd this year and the Chancel Choir is singing for the 7:00 pm service. The choir will sing an anthem called "Restoration" based on a Kievan Synodal Chant arranged by Heather Sorenson. The remaining Sundays of March will feature the Chancel Choir, the Chancel Bell Choir and Living Waters Band.

As Holy Week begins, the Chancel Choir will sing the triumphant anthem "Make Way for the King" by A. Gartner. The Palm Sunday service will end with a foreshadowing to the passion of Jesus with Brad Gardner singing "Gethsemane: "I Only Want to Say" from Jesus Christ Superstar. Gretta Thorson will sing "In this Very Room" and "I Don't Know How to Love You" for the Maundy Thursday service. Good Friday's service is on April 15th Brad Gardner will sing with powerful music. "Bring Him Home" from Les Miserable, and the Chancel Choir will sing "He Carries My Cross" with oboe and cello accompaniment. Also, the choir will sing "Requiem" by Eliza Gilkyson dedicated to victims of natural disaster. The service will include cello solos and organ.

On Easter we celebrate with brass, timpani, organ, bells and choir. This service will send you out in the spirit of rejoicing of the risen Lord.

REACTIVATION OF THE PARISH MINISTER TEAM

Knowing there is a role for both pastor and lay in a crisis, parish ministers are an extended ministry of the church and serve as tangible witnesses to the care of the community. Parish ministers are committed volunteers who seek to reach out as the presence of Christ to those who are in short term need of care. Before the Covid-19 pandemic, parish ministers were asked to make visits to hospitals or long term/transitional care facilities. Currently, as care team member in-person visits are on hold, the care extended by our parish minister team will come in a phone call or hand-written note. It is important to mention that parish ministers always maintain confidentiality; names, conversations, and situations are never revealed unless permission has been granted first. Parish ministers have received many hours of training by the Lead Consultant of Caring Ministries, Rev. Dr. Christie Neuger; they are provided with continual education and supervision throughout their ministry work in this role.

Please let the church office know if you or someone from the church is hospitalized or admitted to a care facility, as churches are no longer called during the admission intake.


