I write this a few hours after Easter Sunday worship - our first in-person Easter since 2019! Well, it's more than a few hours after worship. It's also after a nap and a good night's sleep (and perhaps before yet another nap?). With gratitude

and delight, I can tell you Easter was our highest-attended in-person worship service in years. I was glad to see so many of you and to know others were able to connect online and by phone without interruption, as well. As we enter the summer season, I'm looking forward to addressing some of your questions about God, faith, church, the Bible, and life in the "So Many Questions!" worship series. Time and again, this church proves questions are welcome, faith is a journey, and there's room to explore. Reading over your submissions this spring has been enlightening and gives me ideas for upcoming worship series, too. Thank you for being curious! I hope you'll invite a friend to experience worship with you this summer, or if a particular question is intriguing, that you'll pass along a link to the sermon archives. We do spend time, money, and energy advertising events in the life of the church. But nothing will ever beat your personal invitation. Will you invite someone?

I am praying daily about what ministry looks like in the life of the church this summer and fall. Is it a new Bible study for people who never read it and want to try for the first time? What about a mentoring ministry pairing young adults and older adults? Maybe it's time for pub theology, a time together in a local brewhouse to chat about God while enjoying a tasty beverage. Perhaps it's a new kind of community education forum or even a mini conference in alignment with our mission. Thank you for dreaming big dreams! Whatever we try, it will take people showing up and people welcoming newcomers with authentic attitudes. We try to make spaces warm and inviting, we learn about

new hospitality tactics. But nothing will ever beat your welcoming attitude. Will you welcome someone?

But before a summer of questions and a fall of new opportunities, we come to spring with new seasons of ministry together. My clergy colleague, Rev. Hope Hutchison, is slated to be made a fully-ordained United Methodist deacon in May and we celebrate this accomplishment with her! Deacons, like elders, are an ordination track in the UMC, though with different callings. As an elder, I am called to word, service, order, and sacrament. As a deacon, Rev. Hope is called to word and service. Confused? Before the mid-90s. UM clergy were ordained as a deacon and then as an elder, while now they are two separate roles. While we are both ordained to word (preaching) and service (inviting and encouraging people to serve their neighbor in the name of God), I'm also ordained to order (leading a church) and sacrament (presiding over communion and baptism). We'll talk more about this in worship. In the meantime, I invite you to join me in congratulating Rev. Hope for her ordination! Additionally please remember that while we are your clergy team, you are the ministers! All members of a church are called as ministers, in that you offer or minister to your neighbors with the love of God! You are in that sense "ordained" for greatness. Will you minister to someone?

Will you invite someone? Will you welcome someone? Will you minister to someone? Three big questions to enter the summer season with, friends. May your response be "Yes," and may the Holy Spirit lead you on a blessed path in the weeks to come! Now, off to that second post-


# PLEASE USE THE MAIN ENTRY ON SUNDAY MORNINGS

- May 29, 2022 (Memorial Day weekend)
- July 3, 2022 (Independence Day weekend)
- September 4, 2022 (Labor Day weekend)
- December 25, 2022 (Christmas Day)
- January 1, 2023 (New Year's Day) Pandemic concerns will linger in 2022 as we live into an era of more stability. We continue to (re)build worship teams and giving our many servant volunteers intentional breaks will give them more excitement and less obligation to lead worship services. These Sundays had historically low attendance prepandemic and worship attendance numbers continue to rebuild. # CALL FOR SERVANT VOLUNTEERS: WORSHIP TECH CREW

Our tech crew has worked incredibly hard for months, overseeing sound, slides, cameras for 130+ worship services since March 2020. Now, we call on you to join the team. While there's more to it than what's below, the essential functions are simple and accessible:

Sound: Set up the microphones. Too loud? Turn it down. Too soft? Turn it up.

Slides: Tap "next" to get to the next slide or video.

Cameras: Tap "Camera 1," 2, or 3 as leaders go to their designated spots.

You will be trained, you will be welcomed, you will be amazed at how quickly you will become competent with your role. Plus, the camera operator gets to use a joystick!

Please step up if you have even remote skills/interest. We want to be able to continue to provide online worship experiences, and this relies on building a robust tech crew roster, thank you!

#### Advance Care Planning Workshop

Join us for this important conversation when we will have the opportunity to consider some meaningful questions about our health, our life, and our death. In this workshop, we will begin either working on and/or completing our Health Care Directives. We are excited to welcome back the Rev. Edward Holland, a retired hospice chaplain and marriage and family therapist, who has worked for many years to encourage people to talk to their loved ones about what matters most, especially their health changes. "Don't ever let that happen to me!" For many years words: prior to their deaths, I vividly remember my parents emphatically saying this to me and my sister and brother whenever our mom and dad heard about someone who spent long periods of time on futile, aggressive life support before dying. I suspect most of us would never want that to happen to us or to those we love. While not a perfect solution, a Health Care Directive can help to assure that our choices at the end of life are honored. Advance Care Planning can make a difference. Each of us has a right (and I would argue, a responsibility) to make decisions and express our wishes about our health care options, including end of life care. And, we have a right to select a surrogate decision maker (agent) who can make health care decisions on our behalf when we are unable and/or unwilling to decide for ourselves. In Minnesota, what many still call a living will, is now correctly and legally known as a Health Care Directive, a written document which gives each of us the opportunity to select a health care agent (surrogate decision maker) or agents and to give instructions about the care that we want and/or don't want if we are seriously ill and incapacitated. Having a Health Care Directive can be valuable for all adults, regardless of current age or health status.

Advance Care Planning involves a series of conversations between individuals and their loved ones and their healthcare providers. The goal is for everyone to be on the same page, regarding each individual's values, goals, and wishes to minimize confusion, fear, anger, and conflict should a situation ever occur where communication is no longer possible. If you have not completed your Health Care Directive or would like to update your current one, please attend this workshop. Health Care Directive forms, as well as other helpful resources, will be available. Ed will gently lead us in this conversation, and with his experience be able to answer any specific questions that might arise. Remember, "it's always too soon until it's too late" to have this conversation!

In local U.S. communities, women and girls are being bought and sold against their will. Pennsylvania students are educating their community about sex-trafficking at home and abroad

#### RUMC LIBRARY NEWS

A number of items: First, I wish to thank the following persons for book donations to our church library - Rev. Lynn Borgeson (books for Black History Month); Maxene Schwanke (UM studies); John and Vicki Sells (Devotional); Sandra Nelson (Self-Help); Malissa Whitaker (Fiction); Lynne Alexander (assorted). Their gifts are thoughtful and purposeful in their use by others and in serving the mission of our church. If you wish to see the most recent books new to the library, the list is on display on top of the check-out kiosk. As a side note, there have been a few books returned that have been out for a few years as people have done some cleaning in the pandemic. If you see any RUMC books in your cleaning, just drop them off in the kiosk for others to read.

Then, I report that our books (a total of 2,956) have been catalogued online in a service called 'TinyCat', a division of LibraryThing. This allows others outside our church to see our holdings,



and allows persons to find reviews and recommendations, to be part of online book discussions, and more. Check it out. Go to our church website, richfieldumc.org/library. You can search by title, subject, author, or keyword. We are the 1,080<sup>th</sup> largest non-personal library in TinyCat.

And, for the future, I would be very happy to have you tell me the best books you have read in the now two years of Pandemic Time. If you are so inclined to make a book donation of these "goodies", please remember that our library serves the purposes and mission of our church. #### Rapid Response Update

In the first few months of 2022, the Richfield Foundation granted the Church and Society Team \$1000 to use to fund Rapid Response Relief. 
